In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to present the 2017 Crop Report for Santa Cruz County. The report represents estimated acreage, yield and gross values of agricultural products produced in Santa Cruz County.

The total gross production value of Santa Cruz County agricultural commodities for 2017 was \$581,200,000. This represents a decrease of 9 percent, or \$56,132,000 below the 2016 production value of \$637,332,000. Gross production yield and value is influenced by factors such as weather, labor and the marketplace.

It is important to emphasize that figures presented in this report are gross values and do not include costs incurred by growers that include but are not limited to labor, land preparation, irrigation, pest management, transportation, cooling, marketing, equipment, assessments, regulatory costs or loss experienced by individual operations. Also, the figures do not reflect the total contribution of agriculture to the economy of Santa Cruz County. Farm employment and other farm-related services add significant value and benefits to the local economy.

Strawberries remain the number one crop in Santa Cruz County with an estimated value of \$211,196,000 on approximately 2,600 planted acres. Strawberry production yields were high in 2017 but a reduction in planted acreage and lower than usual market price in the summer resulted in a lower overall value. Raspberries remain the number two crop with an estimated value of \$111,128,000. Berries (strawberries, raspberries and blackberries) saw an overall decrease in planted acreage and a lower market price resulting in a 15% decrease in their combined gross production value compared to 2016.

Vegetable crops saw an overall increase in production yields and value with brussels sprouts recording one of their best years on record with a 37% increase in value from the previous year at \$19,417,000. Livestock and animal products remain strong in our county with a value of \$8,139,000 and timber production, an important part of our county's agriculture, had a strong year with a reported value of \$7,077,000.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to all the farmers, ranchers, boards, commissions, packinghouses and agencies who contributed vital data without which this report would not be possible, and many thanks to my staff for their dedication to compiling and producing the 2017 Santa Cruz County Crop Report.


