I am pleased to present the 2023 Crop Report for Santa Cruz County pursuant to Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code. The total estimated gross production value of Santa Cruz County agricultural commodities for 2023 is \$654,710,000, a decrease of 1.8% from 2022. Gross production yield and value are influenced by factors such as weather, labor, and the marketplace.

It is important to note that figures presented in this report are gross values and do not include costs incurred by growers such as labor, land preparation, irrigation, integrated pest management, transportation, marketing, and regulatory costs. These figures also do not reflect the total contribution of agriculture to the economy of Santa Cruz County, farm employment and other farm-related services add significant value and benefits to the local economy.

Strawberries remain the number one crop in Santa Cruz County with an estimated value of \$184,856,000 on approximately 2,363 planted acres. Although price remained relatively steady, the total gross production value for strawberries fell by approximately 16% compared to 2022, as did total production (tons per acre). The reduced production and gross value were not unexpected due to the storm damage and flooding that occurred from December 2022 through March of 2023. Although some growers eventually saw their fields recover, the early damage and delay caused losses that persisted throughout the season. Berries overall (strawberries, raspberries and blackberries) represent approximately 60 percent of the total gross production value for the County.

Also impacted by the storms of early 2023 was vegetable production, where delays in planting activities and other weather-related issues contributed to a drop in production value of approximately 10% compared to 2022, with an overall value of \$90,988,000. Nursery crops (nursery stock, cut flowers, and cut greens) had a better year, returning to its 2021 production value after seeing a modest drop in 2022, and even gaining some ground, with a gross value of \$145,490,000 in 2023. Apples and wine grapes held relatively steady compared to 2022, with production values of \$11,876,000 and \$5,603,000, respectively.

On the cover of this year's report is a photo of the new South County Government Center in Watsonville, where our office is now located. The Center officially opened its doors in May 2024, and offers support and services for South County residents from multiple departments besides ours, including Human Services, Clerk/Elections, Treasurer-Tax Collector, Auditor-Controller, Cooperative Extension, and the South County Career Center.

A special thanks to my staff for their hard work in putting this report together and to the Santa Cruz County growers and ranchers that voluntarily supplied their valuable data, without which this report would not be possible.




